(b.) Furniture.—Loans not exceeding £75 (free of interest) may be made for the purchase of household furniture, and in such cases applicants are required to produce the vendor's price-list of the articles required. These loans are granted only to married men (or men with dependants requiring a loan) who are in employment, or who are established in business, or are subsidized
