II. EXTRACTS FROM THE ANNUAL REPORTS OF PRINCIPALS OF TRAINING COLLEGES.

1. AUCKLAND.

(H. G. COUSINS, M.A., Principal.)

I beg to submit my annual report for the year 1922. The admission of a large number of students, supplementing those already in College, led to considerable overcrowding and made the year's work very difficult. The total admissions for the year were 61 men and 124 women—total, 185 new students. The following shows the numerical strength of the College at the end of the year: Men: Division A, 57; Division B, 34; Division D, 3; clause 33 (4), 3: total men, 97. Women: Division A, 222; Division B, 27; Division D, 2: total women, 251. Total men and women, 348.
