


Fig. 11. Cross sections of Austrian Pine (Pinus unchinea). Sap stain at three months was slight, as shown in left-hand section. After three months the sap stain developed rapidly, as shown in the right hand section.




Fig. 111. (Cross sections of European Larch (Larix europea). Slight darkenings of outer sapwood zone indicate slight sap-stain.
