

Power has been provided for the creation of easements or other buildings necessary for the full use of any public domain, and subject to the limitations with respect to the number of days upon which changes may be made for admission to a stand, Domain Boards are authorized to fix charges for the use of any public building and generally to regulate admission to the same. A further useful provision enables a Domain Board to appropriate any part of its domain for special purposes, in- cluding the use of the same for the carrying out of the Minister's orders in respect to the vehicles of persons using the domain, and the Board may fix such charges for the use of such land as may be necessary for the carrying out of the Minister's orders. Suitable powers have also been provided for the purpose of giving Domain Boards authority to deal with respect to persons entering the domain for trade or business purposes.

Various minor amendments and machinery provisions have also been included for the purpose generally of simplifying procedure and facilitating the carrying out and enjoyment of the public domain.

A pamphlet has been printed and issued to all Domain Boards explaining briefly the principal changes made in the law and relating to certain of the provisions which, although not new, are from the subject of correspondence between the Department and the Boards.
