The total funds of the societies and branches as at the 31st December, 1928, amounted to £3,728,087, made up as follows: Sick and Funeral Funds (inclusive of amounts transferred to special funds out of surplus), £3,457,115. Medical and Management Funds, goods, &c., £270,972. Dividing the total funds by the number of members at the end of the year it is found the average capital per member is now £36 18s. 9d.
