I have the honour to present the annual report on the Police Force for the year ended 31st March last.

STRENGTH OF FORCE.

On the 31st March last the number of permanent members of the Force of all ranks was 1,146, being an increase of 41 during the year. The total is made up as follows:—

STATIONS.

New stations have been established during the year at New Lynn, Moera, Beckenham, and North New Brighton, and the station at Weber has been closed.

CASUALTIES.

The following are the casualties for the year ended 31st March last: Retired on pension under the Public Service Superannuation Act, 5; retired as medically unfit, 8; died, 5; resigned voluntarily, 20; called upon to resign, 7; dismissed, 3: total, 48. This is eighteen less than in the preceding year.
