ORDERS OF REFERENCE.

Extracts from the Journals of the House of Representatives.

FRIDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF AUGUST, 1929.

Ordered, "That a Select Committee be appointed, consisting of ten members, to whom shall be referred all Bills specially dealing with the revision of the law; with power to confer and sit together with any similar Committee appointed by the Legislative Council; the Committee to have power to call for persons, papers, and records; three to be a quorum: the Committee to consist of Mr. Barnard, Mr. Bodkin, Mr. Broadfoot, Mr. Field, Mr. Lysnar, Mr. Mason, the Hon. Sir Apirana Ngata, the Hon. Mr. Downie Stewart, Mr. Wilkinson, and the mover."—(Hon. Mr. WILFORD.)

WEDNESDAY, THE 11TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1929.

Ordered, "That the Imprisonment for Debt Limitation Amendment Bill be referred to the Statutes Revision Committee."—(Mr. MASON.)

WEDNESDAY, THE 9TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1929.

Ordered, "That the Law Practitioners Amendment (Solicitors' Fidelity Guarantee Fund) Bill be referred to the Statutes Revision Committee."—(Hon. Mr. WILFORD.)
