Section 17 of the Finance Act, 1935, increased by $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. those dependants' pensions which had been reduced by $17\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. under the National Expenditure Adjustment Act, 1932. Economic pensions to ex-soldiers and their dependants were also increased by $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.

WAR VETERANS' ALLOWANCES.

The War Veterans' Allowances Act, 1935, which came into force on the 24th October, 1935, made provision for the payment of allowances to veterans who served with a unit in actual engagement with the enemy and to members of the New Zealand Army Nursing Service who served overseas, if they are now unfit for permanent employment. A veteran includes a member of the New Zealand Expeditionary Force, a member of any other of the British Forces who was domiciled in New Zealand at the commencement of the Great War, and a member of any New Zealand contingent raised for service in the South African War who was domiciled in New Zealand at the commencement of that war.

The following rates of allowances are provided: Unmarried veteran, £52 per annum; married veteran, £52 per annum, with an additional £39 in respect of his wife and £13 on account of each dependent child, the maximum allowance payable under the Act being £143 per annum. Income exemptions of £26 and £39 are provided in the cases of single and married applicants respectively.
