The 1935 figures reveal increases over 1934 in quantities and values of exports of butter, lamb, mutten, hides, and calf-skins, rabbit-skins, pelts and gold. Decreases in both quantities and values occurred in cheese, wool, and kauri-gum. In the cases of beef, tallow, and sausage-casings, a decreased quantity was exported, but the value was higher in each case. The most notable increase in value occurred in the case of butter—namely, an increase of £3,573,964.
