(h) The Liquor Factor.

Previously the only statistics obtained in regard to the influence of liquor as a factor in accidents was in cases where intoxication of the driver was judged to be a cause of accident. Last year, however, if the driver of a motor-vehicle involved in an accident was to any extent under the influence of liquor the police were asked to enter that fact on the report, even though it could not be stated to be a cause of the accident.
