TUESDAY, MAY 13, 1856.

- 1. The House met pursuant to adjournment; Mr. Speaker and thirty members being present; Mr. Speaker read prayers and took the chair.
- 2. Petition of Alexander Brown:—Mr. Lee presented a petition from Alexander Brown, showing how he had served as a volunteer with H. M. Troops during the conflicts with the natives in the North of New Zealand, that he had been severely wounded, the effects of his wound incapacitating him from gaining a livelihood, and praying the House to take his case into its favourable consideration.

Petition received, read, and ordered to be printed.

The Governor transmits to the House of Representatives, copy of a letter dated 23rd August, 1854, from Mr. Wm. Archer, a member of the Legislative Council of Van Diemens Land calling attention to the new Botanical Work "Flora Novæ Zealandiæ" published by Dr. J. D. Hooker, under the sanction of the British Government, and suggesting a contribution from the New Zealand Legislature similar to that given by the Legislative Council of Van Diemen's Land in the case of Dr. Hooker's book on the Botany of that Colony, in order to meet his personal expenditure in the publication of that Work.
