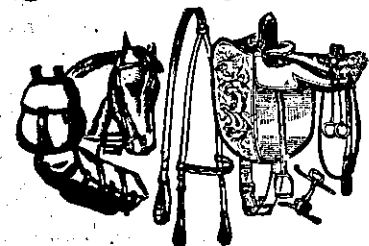

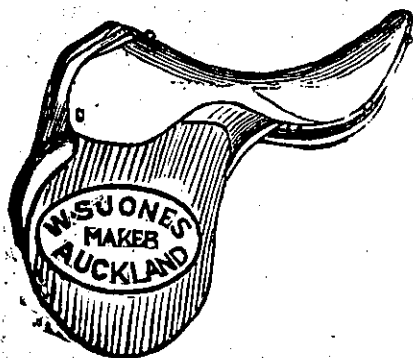

HANDICAP MAIDEN PLATE of 35 sovs.,

all horses that have never won an advertised race
exceeding 30 sovs. at time of starting. Nomination
1/2 sov., acceptance 1 sov. Distance 1 mile.

HANDICAP HURDLES of 70 sovs., second
horse to receive 10 sovs. out of the stakes. Over
eight flights of hurdles. Nomination 1 sov., accep-
tance 2 sovs. Distance 2 miles.

ZEALANDIA HANDICAP of 40 sovs.,
second horse to receive 5 sovs. out of the stakes.
Nomination 1 sov., acceptance 1 sov. Distance 5 fur-
longs.
